Summary	<p>All new University of Phoenix bachelor's degree alumni students who (i) apply for and enroll in a University of Phoenix master's degree program; (ii) have an aggregate GPA of 3.25 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) in their University of Phoenix associate's degree; and (iii) apply for this Forever a Phoenix® Master's Scholarship – May 2024 ("Scholarship") prior to the deadline and register and post attendance in their first class between May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024 and May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024 ("Initial Attendance Window") will have the opportunity to be considered for one of twenty-five (25) scholarships worth up to a maximum of \$2,000 each, distributed over 11 courses.</p> <p>NOTE: Students must begin the admissions application prior to completing this scholarship application.</p>
